Lay people and clergy are invited to join Bishop Frank Griswold at Seabury to explore Anglican spirituality and the rhythm of our worship. Praying Shapes Believing will include reading and reflection with a community of students led by Bishop Griswold, former Bishop of Chicago and former Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, and the Rev. Dr. Donna Jalongo. The course draws on Griswold's book, *Praying Our Days*, published in 2009 by Church Publishing.

This course may be taken for academic credit, CEU's or for enrichment. Course participation requires online work and three intensive weekend classes at Seabury.
